Established in 2016, Mamik is a community organization representing and supporting its urban Indigenous population through culturally safe services offered in collaboration with local Indigenous communities and organizations, as well as various partners. Mamik advocates for the rights and interests of Indigenous people in the cities to improve their living conditions. It assists the Indigenous population by facilitating access to adequate and affordable housing, first- and second-line culturally relevant services, as well as improving their economic conditions by focusing on education and graduation rates. Their mission is to improve the quality of life of the Indigenous population on the territory and in the cities through the development and support of collaborative initiatives between the different players who intervene in favour of the collectivity's well-being.

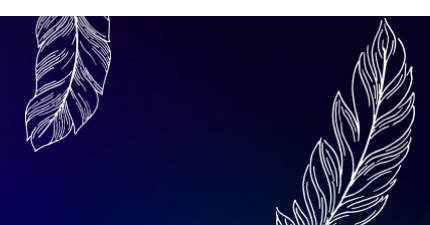

Kitci Amik is an Indigenous organization working with and for First Nations, offering them services inclusive to their needs.
